3. Park Operational Status
 - a. Reopened Campground: On April 15th of this year the campground partially reopened. A total of 30 campsites were opened for the first time since the 2019 Missouri River Flood. The campground host sites are open and in operation. The remaining sites will be closed until construction of the replacement shower house is completed.
 - b. Day-use Areas: All day-use areas (CCC Shelter, lake front, playground, Interpretive Lewis & Clark Plaza, Gosling Lake Trail and day-use restrooms are open.
 - c. Revenue Bond Project for campground upgrades.
4. Priority Projects
 - a. Revenue Bond Project: This project will include the upgrade of 20 campsites to full hookup (electric, water, septic). Includes installation of a satellite restroom/shower house facility. Project is currently under design and review phase.
 - b. Capital Improvement Project: This project will replace the campground's shower house with a new facility. The old shower house is out of service and unusable due to 2019 flood damage and age of structure.
 - c. Park Office: The park office is partially in operation. Staff anticipate completing interior improvements this fall/winter.
 - d. Keelboat Exhibit Room: Attached to the park office, this area is in the process of being cleaned and reorganized. It is anticipated to be reopened to the public on a limited basis by mid-September of this year (within the next couple of weeks).

- e. Natural Resources Management: Park staff has been working on the River Bottom Forest Restoration Area (located on the SW side of the park). Activity has included cutting and treating Johnson Grass, Bush Honeysuckle, and a planned tree planting. Work is continuing within the prairie restoration areas to control invasive plant species
